BatStateU, in partnership with the University of Wolverhampton in the UK, held a research workshop this 24 to 27 October 2021 for its DOST-British council funded research project entitled “Developing Smart Environmental Resilience Solutions for Coastal areas in the Philippines: Susceptibility, Adaptation and Mitigation Measures: (SEACAP).



The activity aimed to gather researchers and stakeholders of various disciplines who will collaborate on capacity building and identifying emerging technologies that will suit the country’s needs for its environmental resilience. It is a hybrid workshop (face-to-face and virtual) wherein participants from the Philippines and the UK held synchronized virtual seminars to discuss and formulate collaborative research proposals.
