Objectives:

Generally, this project aims to extend support to the affected families of Typhoon Quinta in Barangay Talahib Pandayan, Batangas City

Particularly, this aims to:

- 1. Conduct call for donation from October 30, November 15;
- 2. Distribute relief packages;
- 3. Determine other support that may be provided by the university through a conduct of a rapid need's assessment.

Short Narrative of the Activity:

The Batangas State University, in partnership with the Ayala Young Leaders Alliance – Batangas (AYLA-Eh), brought assistance to Brgy. Talahib Pandayan in Batangas City, one of the communities severely affected by typhoons Quinta and Rolly that recently hit the country, 2020.

Spearheaded by the Extension Service Office (ESO), the relief operation was conducted through the extension project 'Lingap Kabayan' on November 10, 2020 (1st batch) & December 11, 2020 (2nd batch). Situated at a coastal area in the southern part of Batangas City, Brgy. Talahib Pandayan was one of the university's adopted communities in its Adopt-a-Barangay Program.

'Lingap Kabayan' is an initiative of the ESO personnel, extension heads and coordinators in the aftermath of the devastating effects of typhoons Quinta, Rolly and Ulysses that hit Batangas province.

A call for donations was made on November 2, and the office received almost P60,000.00 worth of cash and inkind donations from several private groups and individuals, including Sunlife Seoul Tower Sales Team, who also helped in repacking the goods. The monetary donations were used to purchase hygiene kits and sacks of rice, which were found to be the immediate needs of the community after ESO's initial assessment of the affected families' conditions.

The relief operation benefited 358 families from three sitios of Brgy. Talahib Pandayan. ESO was assisted by the local government unit of the barangay. Six families from the university's own Integrated School also benefitted from the operation.

The second wave of assistance from Soroptimist International was distributed on December 11, 2020. Another 100 families were provided basic needs. Heath center was also provided by disposable diapers, face masks and face shields.


