Bangon Batangas : Training on Basic Tinapa Making



Bangon Batangas is a science-based project that aims to create positive intervention and effective rehabilitation plans to internally displaced population within the communities affected by the Taal volcano eruption. The Batangas State University (BatStateU) has launched the Bangon Batangas project dubbed S&T - based intervention to Taal Volcano's Internally Displaced Population (IDP) through a funding from the Department of Science and Technology-Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic, and Natural Resources Research and Development (DOST- PCAARRD) that aims to assess the damages brought about by the Taal eruption in January 2020.

One of the interventions that has been use for the IDP is the Basic Tinapa Making. With this, BatStateU through Extension Services visited different barangays which was fully affected by the Taal Volcano eruption. They were given basic training on how to make smoke fish using native fishes of Taal Lake which is the Bangus and Tilapia. Training kits were also given and the prototype smokehouse built by the DOST-PCAARRD.

Bangon Batangas : Training on Proper Packaging and Labeling
