Dr. Tirso A. Ronquillo, President of Batangas State University (BatStateU), The Philippines' National Engineering University, has pledged to be at the forefront of driving innovation as he officially took the oath as an Executive Member - Academe Representative of the National Innovation Council (NIC) in accordance with R.A. No. 11293, the Philippine Innovation Act.

The oath was officiated by Hon. Arsenio M. Balisacan, the Secretary of the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA), marking Dr. Ronquillo's formal assumption of the role. The solemn oath-taking ceremony occurred on July 6 at BatStateU's innovation hub, the Knowledge, Innovation, Science and Technology (KIST) Park Center, in the STEER Hub Building at BatStateU Alangilan.

Dr. Ronquillo's acceptance into the NIC signifies his dedication to fulfilling the mandates outlined in Republic Act No. 11293, including developing the country's strategic vision for innovation, engaging in strategic and innovation policymaking using technological expertise and strategic intelligence, coordinating with sectors and agencies to ensure policy coherence, and communicating innovation policies to both local and international audiences. NIC executive members are also tasked with implementing an action agenda for the development of the country's capacity for innovation, monitoring the progress of strategic innovation programs, including publicly-funded research, development, and extension (RD&E) projects, establishing and managing the Innovation Fund, and providing annual reports to Congress on the Act's progress.

Following the official oath-taking ceremony, President Ronquillo and Secretary Balisacan engaged in a productive discussion regarding initiatives aimed at leveraging the
