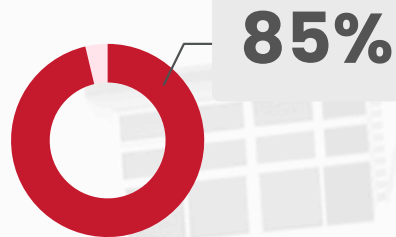
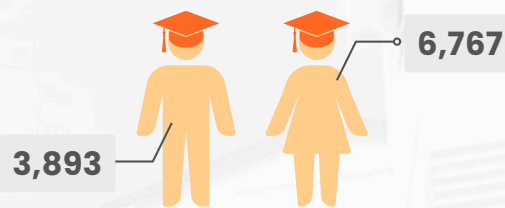

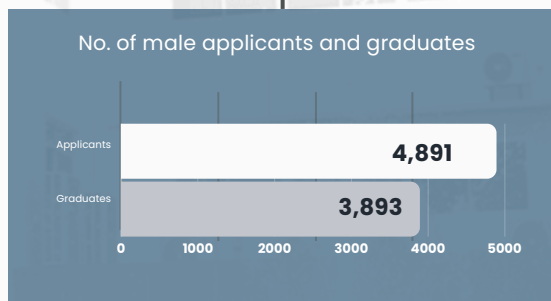

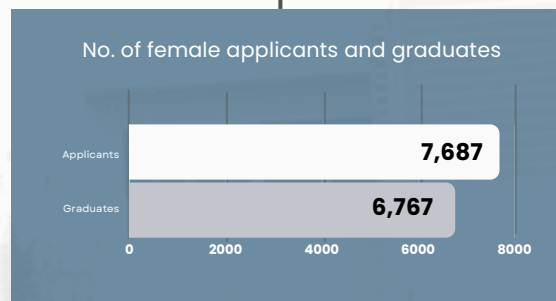
The data reveals that more females have graduated in 2022 with 8.4 percent higher rate than male graduates.



Of the total 12,578 applicants for graduation, 85% (10,660) qualifies for graduation.



The data shows that 79.6 percent (3,893) of male applicants successfully graduated.



The data shows that 88 percent (6,767) of female applicants successfully graduated.
