Campus journalism empowers students by giving them a voice in their school community and opportunities to investigate and influence campus issues. On June 27, 2023, the College of Arts and Sciences faculty from Batangas State University conducted a journalism workshop at Elementary. Led by Ms. Montealegre and Mr. Robert Marrel Dela Vega, faculty members taught Grade 4 and 5 students news writing, broadcasting, editorial cartooning, and photojournalism.

The event began with a prayer introductions, after which Mr. Dela Vega guided students through news writing and even had them role-play as newscasters. Ms. producer, radio Lenie Ilao. a broadcasting techniques and showcased voice-acting skills. Mr. Reymar Barcelon led a session on shading techniques in editorial cartooning, and students engaged in a fun activity recognizing anime images.

Mr. Dela Vega also presented photography tips, such as using the "rule of thirds." 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
Basic Computer Literacy: Competency, Progress and Understanding


