Batangas State University (BatStateU) has recently taken a significant step to strengthen its commitment to locally sourced products. The university has implemented a new policy encouraging all of its colleges and units to actively support products originating from local sources.

In a monitoring and tracking effort conducted in 2023, a noteworthy quantity of products from local sources was documented as having been procured by BatStateU. These products encompassed a diverse range, including local delicacies, handicrafts, as well as various wet and dry goods. The BatStateU's Policy Guidelines for Sustainable Development (p.52) states that the University shall support local farmers and producers to ensure quality and affordable produce thereby sustaining the livelihood of the community. The University shall prioritize purchase products of local farmers and producers for University events, festivals and other related activities.
