WHEREAS, the Board through Resolution No. 136, s. 2022 approved the University Policy Guidelines for the attainment of Sustainable Development Goals;

WHEREAS, to ensure the attainment of the goals, the University shall be guided by internal policies designed to assure balance between social, economic and environmental sustainability;

WHEREAS, Chapter 2 of the approved policy guidelines focused on sustainable support to communities to realize SDGs 1 (No Poverty), 4 (Quality Education) and 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth) which provides specific support of the University to students, faculty, employees and organizations and other external agencies, partner agencies, MSMEs and local communities in the form of access to its resources;

WHEREAS, an individual policy is provided in every chapter which prescribes the specific action or step to be undertaken by the University to achieve the SDGs;

WHEREAS, this proposed policy prescribes support of the University to students, faculty, employees and organizations and other external agencies, partner agencies, MSMEs and local communities in the form of access to its resources;

WHEREAS, under this policy, the University shall grant free access to the following facilities and workspaces to BatStateU students, faculty, and internal groups, organizations provided that the use of such facilities is for educational, technology acquisition, training and research purposes, or other analogous purposes and will not in any way be used for personal gain, fundraising and income generating purposes;

WHEREAS, the University shall impose applicable fees if the facilities will be used for income generating or fund-raising projects to ensure sustainable operations and maintenance of the facilities and equipment used, as well as to cover direct or indirect costs;

WHEREAS, the proposal was presented to the Administrative Council of the University, and after thorough discussion and deliberation, it was endorsed for approval of the Board through Resolution No. 1128-01, s. 2022;

WHEREAS, the same proposal was deliberated upon by the Finance Committee and after thorough discussion and deliberation, it was endorsed for approval of the Board through Resolution No. 2022;

Batangas State University (BatStateU), recognized as the National Engineering University, is dedicated to fostering an inclusive environment for its students, staff, and faculty. A significant aspect of this commitment involves providing public access to various facilities across its campuses, which are named in honor.

The University created the Committee on Naming of Buildings and Halls through OUP Memorandum Order No. 319, s. 2023, which mandated the committee to evaluate the status of facilities and propose appropriate names based on Section IV. K. of the Manual of University Protocols (BOR Resolution No. 49, s. 2021). This process was guided by several legal bases, including the Revised Guidelines on the Naming and Renaming of Public Structures, Republic Act No. 1059 (which prohibits naming public institutions after living persons), Republic Act No. 7160 (Local Government Code), and Republic Act No. 11694 (Revised Batangas State University Charter).

The committee evaluated proposed names for facilities across constituent and extension campuses, categorized into:

- National Heroes
- National Scientists
- National Artists
- Local Heroes
- Significant figures in the local community
- Notable individuals in specific disciplines
- Donors
- Objects (including flora and fauna)
- Place names
- Unique functions and purposes
- Events



The university has named 186 buildings, halls, parks, and open spaces, including notable locations such as Pablo Borbon, Alangilan, Rosario, San Juan, Balayan, Mabini, Malvar, Nasugbu, and Lipa. This initiative has significantly enhanced the sense of identity and pride within the BatStateU community.

The named facilities are accessible to all university members and serve multiple important purposes. Classrooms and laboratories support academic use, fostering innovative teaching and learning practices. Additionally, parks and open spaces are venues for cultural events, performances, and workshops, encouraging participation from students, staff, and local residents. Recreational facilities promote a healthy lifestyle through sports and leisure activities, further enhancing community engagement.
