WHEREAS, the Board through Resolution No. 136, s. 2022 approved the University Policy Guidelines for the attainment of Sustainable Development Goals;

WHEREAS, to ensure the attainment of the goals, the University shall be guided by internal policies designed to assure balance between social, economic and environmental sustainability;

WHEREAS, Chapter 3 of the approved policy guidelines gives emphasis on inclusive academic environment and workplace which supports SDG 2 (Zero Hunger), SDG 3 (Good Health and Wellbeing), SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 5 (Gender Equality), SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities) and SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions) which covers various support aimed at addressing the issues on inclusivity, inequalities, gender and development, and other related SDGs;

WHEREAS, an individual policy is provided in every chapter which prescribes the specific action or step to be undertaken by the University to achieve the SDGs;

WHEREAS, this proposed policy provides that there shall be an available financial aid for students to support the needs of students in order to complete their education. Disadvantaged students enrolled in the University will be given priority to ensure on-time completion of graduation;

WHEREAS, under this policy, the following interventions shall be observed:

- a. Maintain database of enrolled students belonging to special group of persons;
- b. Recommend these students to potential donors/sponsors for financial assistance;
- c. Provide necessary activity and support that will help them complete their education on time;
- d. Develop financial assistance programs for students to sustain their school needs, specifically the poor, underrepresented and students with special needs and deserving students to ensure on-time completion of their chosen degree programs; and
- e. All other interventions to successfully implement the foregoing;

# low-income students hired as student assistants

As part of the university's support to students from low-income families, the Office of Student Organizations prioritized hiring them. For the FY 2023, a total of Php 421,487.25 was allocated for the salary of the student assistants.

#### students receive educational assistance through AICS program

A total of 1,822 low-income students were given educational assistance in partnership of the university with DSWD-Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS) program. Each student received Php 5000.00 cash to cover their educational expenses.

A total of 254 low-income students were given short-term employment under the Cash for Work program. In exchange for the work rendered, recipients are provided with cash to meet their requirement for food and other basic necessities. For FY 2023, a total of Php 2,000,440.00 were given to the CFW beneficiaries.
