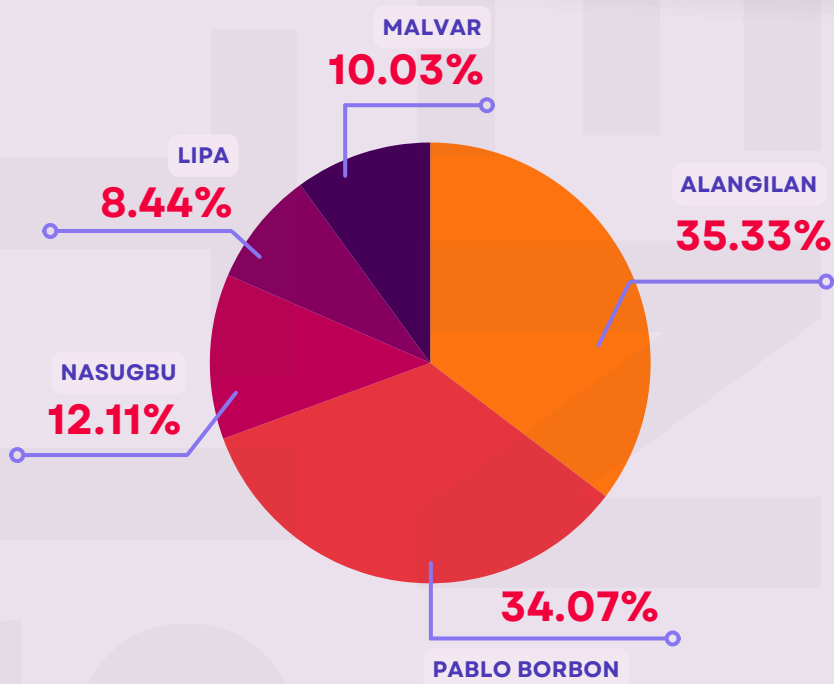
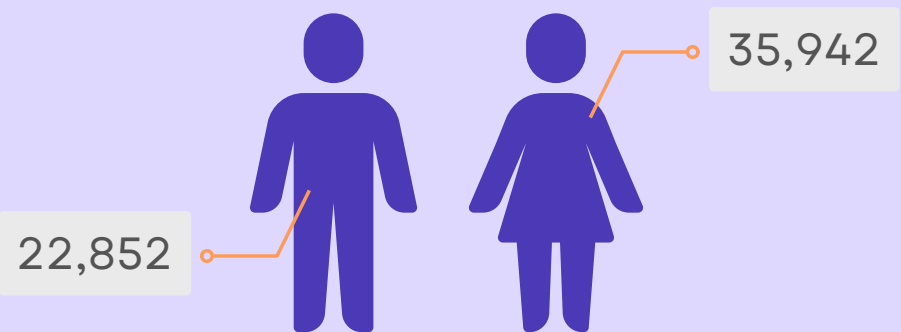


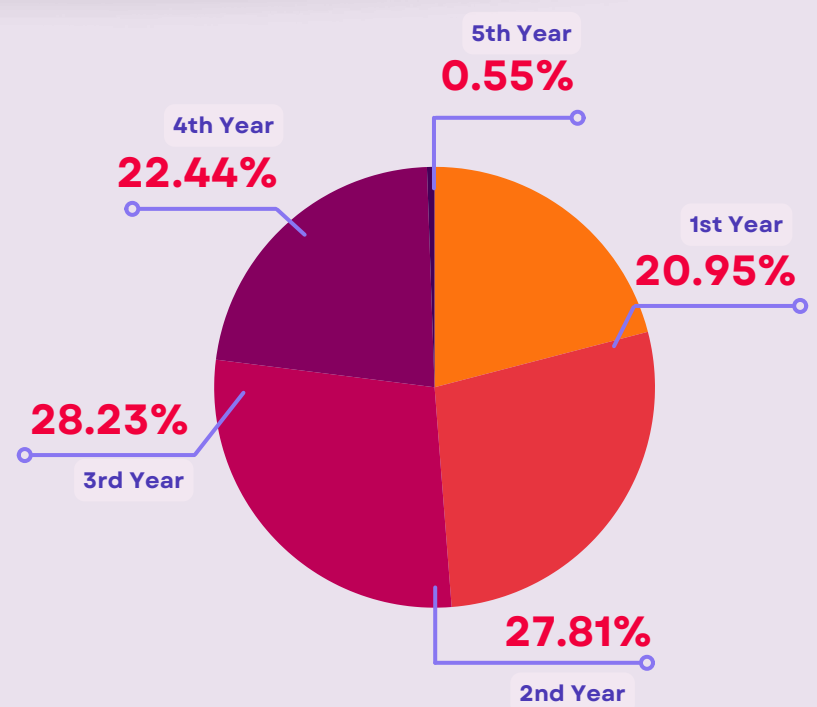
Students' Enrollment Data

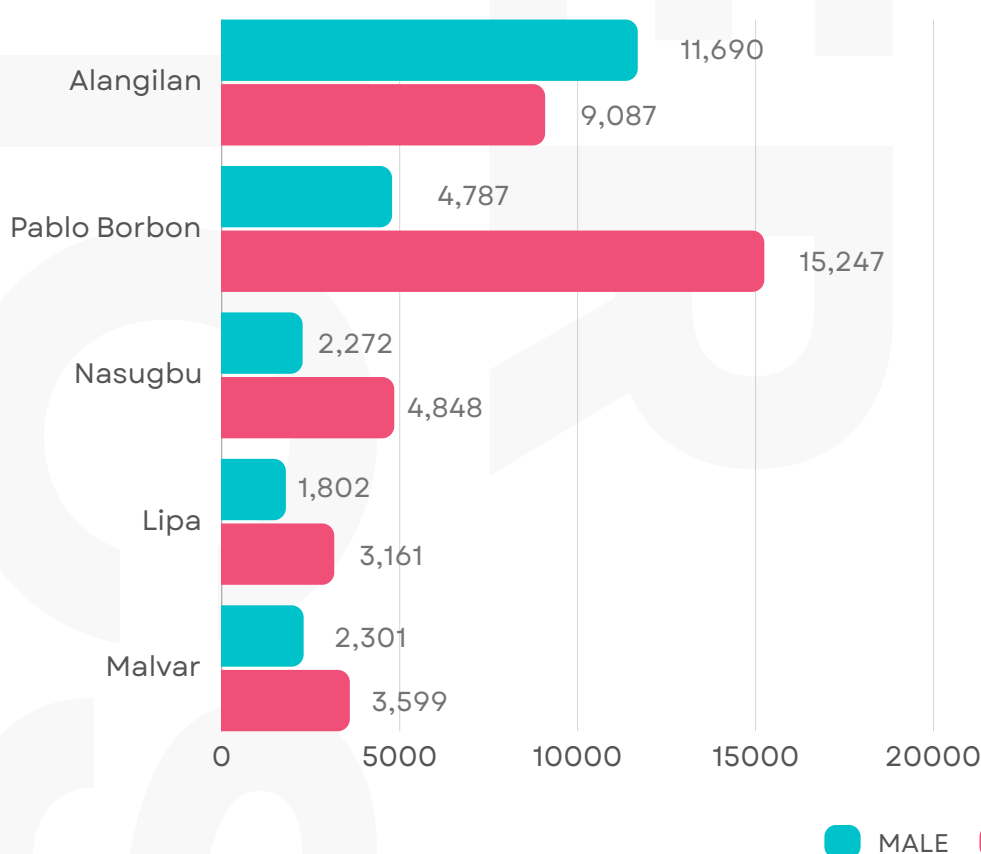


This graph shows the proportion of enrollment in the University's constituent campuses. Alangilan (20,777) and Pablo Borbon (20,034) campuses comprise more than half of the total enrollees with 69.41 percent combined enrolment rate. Nasugbu (7,120) and Malvar (5,900) campuses followed while Lipa (4,963) campus has the least number of enrolment.



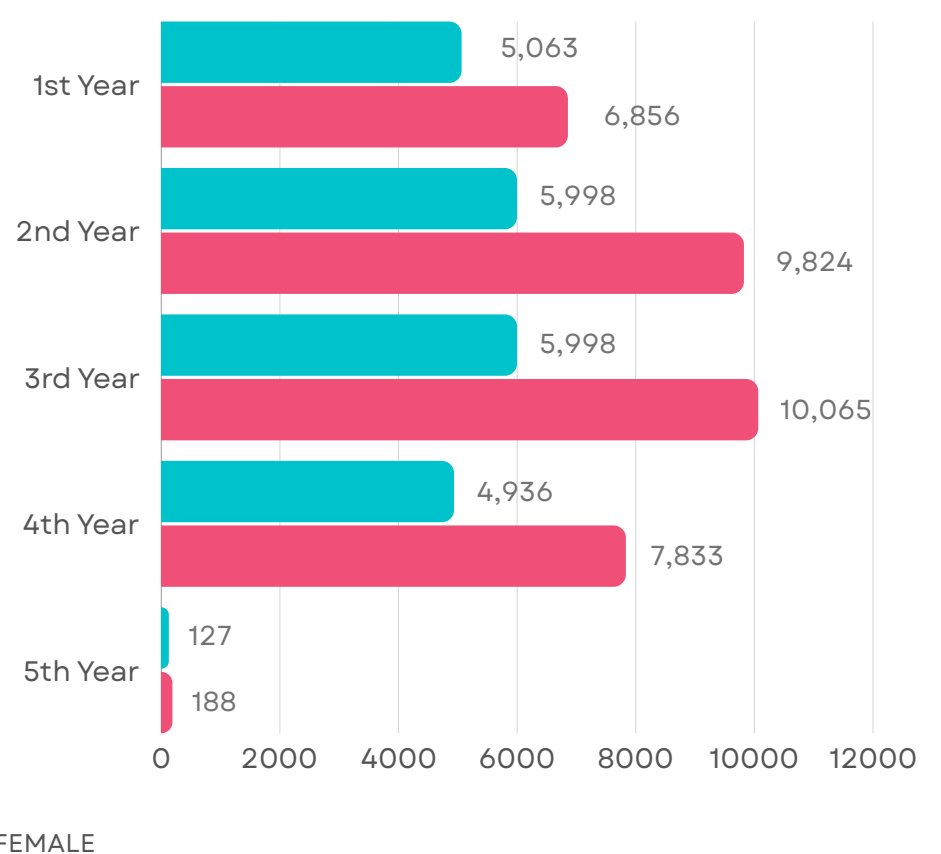
In terms of enrolment per year level, third year students hold the most number of enrollees with 16,063 or 28.23 percent of the total enrolment. It is then followed by second year students with 15,822 enrollees comprising 27.81 percent, fourth year with 12,769 or 22.44 percent, first year with 11,919 or 20.95 percent enrolled students and finally, fifth year with only 0.55 percent or 315 students.

Male/Female Enrolment per Campus



The graph shows the distribution of male and female students per campus. Alangilan holds the most number of male students (11,690) while Pablo Borbon has the most number of female students (15,247). All constituent campuses except Alangilan have more female enrollees than males.

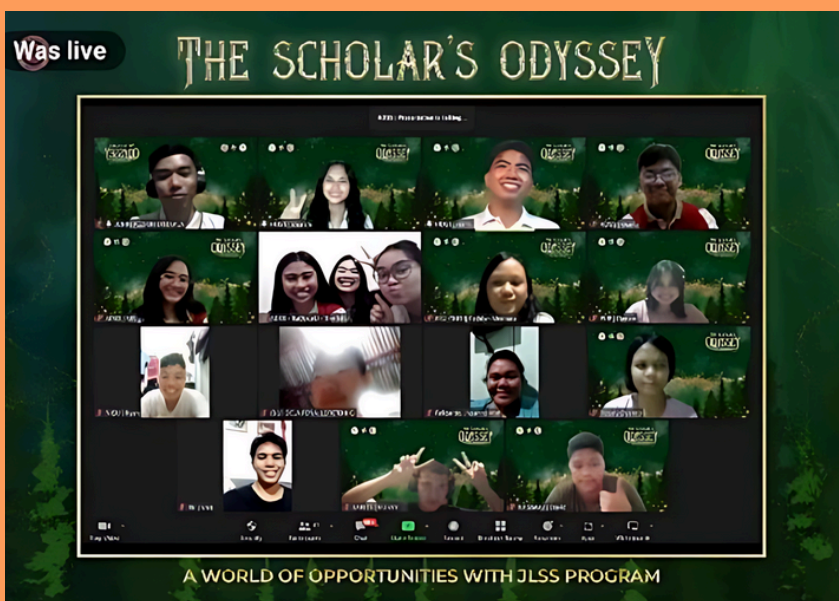
Male/Female Enrolment per Year Level
